



This is the exact bracket in the display with two purple 565.1s, dropping the 240V power feed into an old house.

This crazy piece - seen in the underlit section of the case - was found by Alexander Bulba back in 2010-2012. As he remembers, he and Andrey Kazakevich found it around the village of Kovaly, Belarus. From there, it went to Dan Wagner, and then to me.



The vase and pitcher are both made by НемаН. The vase is likely later (1990s-2000s) and meant for the Western market, as the sticker on it is in English and marked Neman. The small pitcher is likely a 1960s or 1970s product, as it has a similar small НемаН mark as a CD 596.2.



Are these milkglass?

No, likely not in the traditional sense of being made with tin or calcium oxide added to the glass batch.

These are likely some sort of glass ceramic material. It's a specialized glass where

the cooling process creates a partial crystallization, imparting great resistance to thermal shock. I suspect these are a magnesium aluminosilicate glass ceramic. This material is also found in CD 247.5 and CD 541.5 with 1960s dates.
